# About our school

Kingsmeadow Community School is a smaller than average, co-educational 11 – 18 secondary school. We build positive relationships and offer a personal approach to each of our students and families. Our status as the last maintained secondary school in Gateshead means that we are not bound by the rules of a larger trust or academy chain. Every decision we make is closely tailored to the needs of our students, their families, and the local community.

We take pride in offering a highly ambitious academic curriculum. This is centred on what the government describes as 'the strong academic core for all that supports life chances'. This strong academic core ensures that more young people secure the expected standards in Maths and English, whilst also giving them the opportunity to study subjects that interest and inspire them. Across all key stages we deliver a rich variety of learning opportunities in arts, science, technology, humanities, sport and performing arts

This high level of expectation continues into our sixth form, where we offer a wide range of level 3 qualifications for further study. We are delighted that the increasing numbers of pupils who choose Kingsmeadow Community School as their provider for key stage five education are enjoying learning in a new sixth form centre that opened in 2025. All our sixth form students move on to the university course or career of their choice when they leave us.

Set in a professional and well-maintained environment, our school provides a collegiate and supportive atmosphere where the highest standards are set. Our staff are driven by an unwavering belief in the potential of our students, fostering a culture where all grow to become members of the community in the fullest sense.

# Safeguarding at Kingsmeadow

The safety, health and wellbeing of our students is always our primary concern. We work in partnership with parents and carers to ensure that our everyday practices keep students safe and well.

Our staff receive regular safeguarding training. They have the skills and knowledge to spot concerns and know how to report these when appropriate. We do not promise confidentiality to any young person and, where possible, always share concerns with parents or carers so we can work closely to address the problem or issue.

Our students' safety is our number one priority, from security of the site to the welfare of each individual. We ensure that all staff, volunteers and visitors have current DBS checks before working with our students.

The school's Designated Safeguarding Lead is supported by four Deputy Designated Safeguarding Leads who are responsible for Key Stage 3, 4, and 5 students, alongside a nominated Governor for Safeguarding, a health and safety coordinator and online safety coordinator.

# Celebrating our students

## Celebrating achievement

From fantastic key assessment results, to dazzling performances in art, music, and more, our young achievers regularly receive recognition through the school's Culture of Praise.

Our students inspire us every day with their dedication and creativity, and it's not just their successes in academic excellence, but in leadership, effort, and community spirit too. With the school's continued support and encouragement, we are proud to celebrate each and every one of our students, whether their achievement is big or small.

## Recognising good attendance

Statistically, students who attend school regularly achieve much more highly at the end of their time in school. At Kingsmeadow Community School, students who attend more than 95% of the time achieve above the national average and, therefore, better than they would in many other schools.

We recognise that illness and accidents can happen and that, for some students, the effort they put into getting into school each day is huge. For this reason, we run weekly attendance rewards. Every time a student has 100% attendance across a week they receive a ticket into the 'In It to Win It' prize draw - which has included prizes such as a St James' Park Stadium tour, Amazon gift cards, a Smart watch and a family Escape Room visit.

Our students are inspired by a range of recognition and praise. These include everything from receiving a Praise Postcard for excellent effort in the classroom, a free exciting year group activity for great attitude towards key assessments, right through to a nomination at our annual prestigious Kingsmeadow Awards evening. At Kingsmeadow Community School we understand and utilise the power of reinforcement and positive praise.



# Enrichment and extracurricular opportunities

Enrichment and extracurricular activities offer numerous benefits, including improved academic performance, enhanced social skills like teamwork and communication, and boosted confidence and self-esteem. They foster creativity, critical thinking, and problem-solving, while supporting physical health and overall well-being.

## Our enrichment opportunities

Our enrichment programme develops our students' skills and qualities and enhances their application to universities. The programme provides opportunities to extend our students' academic development and help them prepare for their next steps in their educational journey. Educational trips to Barcelona, Poland, Croatia, and Disneyland Paris are some of the recent opportunities we have offered to students.

## Our extracurricular activities

Taking part in extracurricular activities allows for a short break from studies and the opportunity to return to learning refreshed. They are also a great way to demonstrate transferable skills such as communication, teamwork, leadership and problem-solving to future employers and further education providers. Activities on our timetable include rugby, football, trampolining, dodgeball, Kingsmeadow band and choir, games club, VEX robotics, and many more.



# Our school uniform

We set high standards for our school uniform. It identifies Kingsmeadow Community School students as proud members of the school and community. At all times students are to wear their uniform with pride, and respect everything it represents.

Our school's uniform is compulsory for all Year 7 to 11 students

- Kingsmeadow green blazer
- White shirt which fastens at the neck and is tucked in (no polo type shirts)
- Kingsmeadow tie clipped on correctly
- Formal black school trousers, formal black school shorts or Kingsmeadow skirt (no "skinny" fit trousers, flairs, sports shorts or leggings)
- Kingsmeadow tank top (the Headteacher will inform students if they can be removed due to temperature)
- Plain black formal shoes (no trainers, plimsolls, heels)



Our PE uniform

- Kingsmeadow PE t-shirt (quarter zip is an appropriate alternative)
- Black bottoms suitable for PE and sport (shorts, tracksuit bottoms, sport leggings)
- Trainers suitable for PE and sport (any colour is allowed)
- Additional optional items such as football boots, shin pads, gum shield etc., are sport specific.



If a student is missing an item of uniform the school will endeavour to loan an item for that day. Refusal to correct uniform will result in a Level 4 sanction.

Our school uniform is supplied by Michael Sehgal and Sons Ltd. Many parents and carers prefer to choose a preloved school uniform for their child. The Gateshead West Uniform Scheme offers Kingsmeadow uniform items.

# Our school catering

Our dining hall provides a modern catering concept designed by students to recreate the look and feel of a top food court. Key Stage 4 students also have access to lunch time snacks and street food from the Grab-and-Go catering pod situated in their yard. Key Stage 5 students have their own dining area situated in the sixth form block.

Students can choose from a daily two-course special which is freshly cooked on site every day; Pasta King and Curry Pot meals, fresh pizza, Grab and Go sandwiches and wraps, filled jacket potatoes and salads - all at affordable prices served in a relaxed, and informal setting. Students are equally welcome to bring a packed lunch from home and eat it in our dining hall.

## Medical and alternative dietary requirements

The catering team is passionate about ensuring every pupil has the same opportunity to eat school food regardless of their religious and dietary views. If your child has a special dietary requirement - such as diabetic, coeliac, low fat and dairy intolerances or a food allergy the catering team will be happy to plan and provide a school meal that meets your child's needs. The team can also adapt menus to meet religious needs.



# Our exam performance

It is always a pleasure to welcome back our Year 11 and Year 13 students as they return to school in the summer to collect their exam results. We share in their joy at their success and provide them with advice, support and contact information to help them on their next steps. We are so proud of everything that they achieve during their time with us at Kingsmeadow.

## Record results for Year 11

Recent results at Key Stage 4 demonstrated an excellent performance across the whole year group. We are so pleased to see our year 11 students achieving what they need to move on to their chosen next steps in education or employment. We are also delighted that 58 students chose to come back to join our Sixth Form and be part of the school's largest ever Year 12 cohort.

At Key Stage 5 we were also very proud that every student achieved enough to move on to their next step in life - be that university, high-level apprenticeships or employment. The year group achievement meant that university was an option for every year 13 student, with 88% of them getting into their first choice.

Our Sixth Form offers a range of academic A-Levels and vocational subjects, and we keep class sizes small to ensure that every student has the dedicated time and focus they need.

High expectations are placed upon our students, in both work and behaviour. We trust them to respect the increased freedom they will experience throughout their A-level studies and expect the demonstration of high levels of self-reliance and maturity.

We are proud of our new Sixth Form and classroom block. This facility is providing students with modern facilities to flourish in their learning and grow in their character.

Every interaction is an opportunity to develop the good character of our students, and the promotion of positive attitudes, skills and behaviours such as self-control, confidence, motivation and resilience feature heavily in our curriculum. These essential life skills give our students the ability to work well with others, build relationships, manage emotions, and cope with difficult situations, or respond to setbacks when they occur.

Our character curriculum is taught through assemblies, 30 minutes of daily Thrive time, our subjects and living and learning the school's values.



# Careers advice and guidance at Kingsmeadow

Our Careers, Education, Information, Advice and Guidance programme supports our students to identify their future aspirations by exploring potential progression routes and help them to make informed decisions that affect their future education, training, and employment opportunities.

High quality careers education helps our students raise their aspirations, confidence, skills, and knowledge. It increases the students' motivation by linking activities in school with preparation for life post-16 and post-18.

Our comprehensive careers programme is delivered to students in every year group. It is integral to the curriculum and includes aspects of work-related learning, enterprise education and option choices. Students in our Sixth Form are expertly guided in making applications to university, applying for Higher Level Apprenticeships and other non-University post-18 pathways.
